Why is it important to support breastfeeding in ECEC services?

Meeting legal obligations

In Australia, ECEC services have legal obligations to support breastfeeding under various laws and regulations.

Assisting mothers who are returning to work

Supporting mums to breastfeed while their child is in care demonstrates care and understanding, helping them feel confident and supported as they transition back to work.

Supporting health choices

Mums choose to breastfeed for their babies' and their own health. Breastfed children are less likely to get sick when they go to ECEC services. This means fewer infections, allergies, and serious diseases.

Promoting public health

Encouraging breastfeeding in ECEC services supports public health goals.
